Presentation	Suppositories for infants: 700mg		
Presentation	j		
	Liquid: 100mL (Glycerol 1mL/mL)		
Classification	Osmotic laxative		
	May also act through its local irritant effects and have lubricating and faecal softening actions		
Indication	Treatment of constipation		
Dose	Suppository: cut a small sliver from suppository for use		
	Liquid: 0.1 - 0.2mL		
Monitoring	Stool output		
Administration	Rectal Administration		
	Glycerine suppository:		
	Gently insert the sliver fully into the rectum.		
	Recommended to moisten sliver prior to use for ease of administration.		
	Glycerol liquid		
	Draw glycerol solution into a 1mL syringe. Attach Clot Catcher and prime with the solution. Insert 1–2 cm of Clot Catcher through anus and administer prepared dose.		
Adverse Reactions	Diarrhoea, rectal irritation, bleeding per rectum (from insertion of the syringe when liquid used), abdominal pain		
Storage	Room temperature		
Notes	Onset of action: 15 to 30 minutes
