Treatment of hyperemesis gravidarum under the direction of an obstetrician / gynaecologist

Medication Class

B vitamin

Presentation

Tablet: 25 mg

Storage

Store at room temperature, below 25°C

Dose

Nausea and vomiting in pregnancy

Oral:

25-50mg every 6 to 8 hours as required.

Maximum of 200mg in 24 hours.

Administration

Oral

Can be taken with or without food.

Monitoring

Warning: Pyridoxine may be toxic and cause peripheral neuropathy. There have been reports of peripheral neuropathy occurring at doses less than 50mg daily.

Check if the patient is using any other products that contain pyridoxine (e.g. multivitamins) and cease pyridoxine if any signs of peripheral neuropathy occur (e.g. tingling, burning, numbness).

Pregnancy

1st Trimester: Considered safe to use
2nd Trimester: Considered safe to use
3rd Trimester: Considered safe to use
